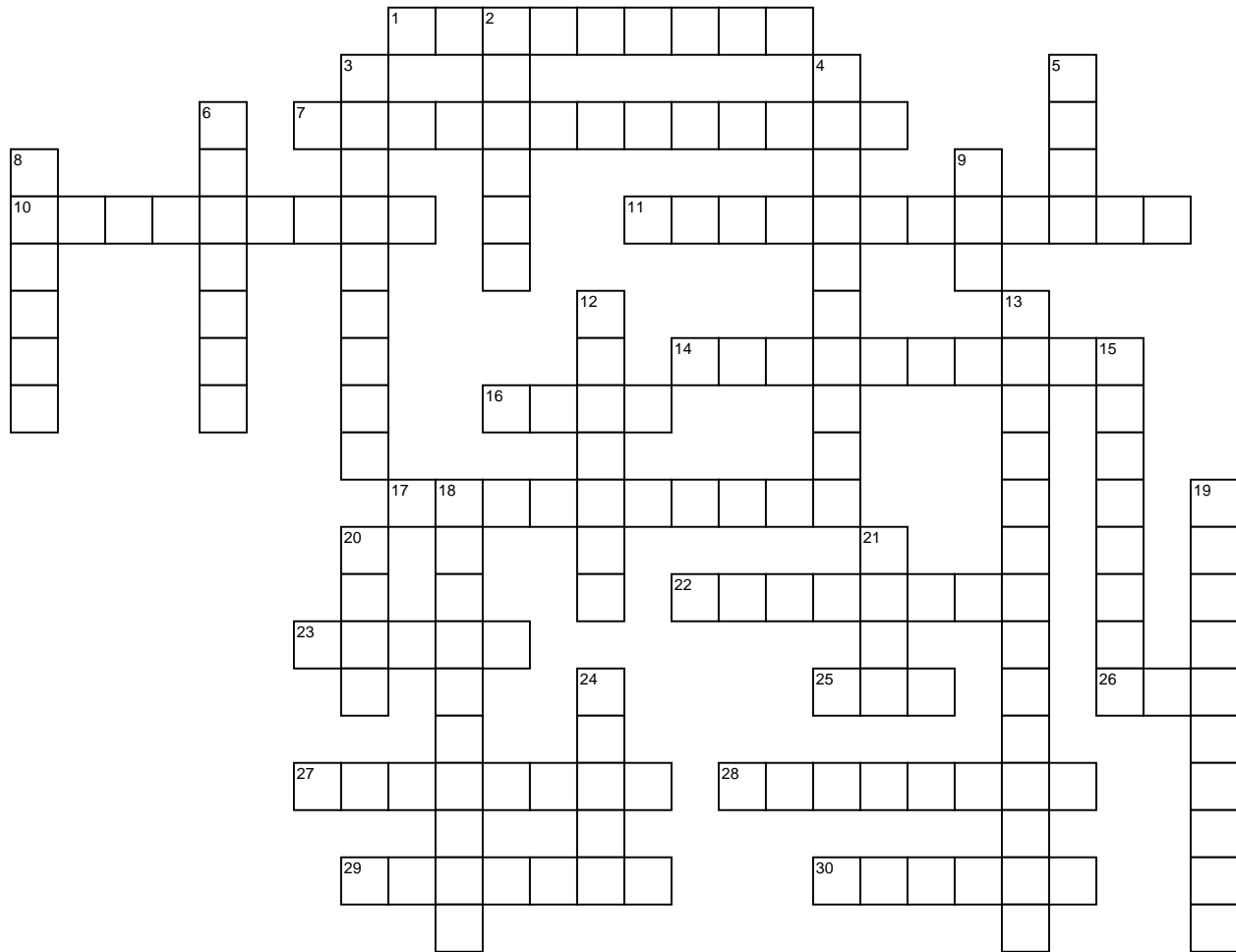

Lesson 5.1 -- Popular Pathogens



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ACROSS

- 1 Invasion of the tissues of the body of a host
- 7 A disease that cannot be transmitted from one animal to another.
- 10 A cell that contains a nucleus and membrane-bound organelles.
- 11 A virus like, bacteria-destroying agent
- 14 A disease transmitted or spread from animal to animal, person to person, or from plant to plant, by direct or indirect contact with the diseased plant or animal.
- 16 Any organism, plant or animal, in or upon which another spends part or all of its existence, and from which it derives nourishment or protection.
- 17 A unicellular organism that lacks a nucleus and membrane-bound organelles.
- 22 In the general sense, anything capable of causing disease
- 23 A self-reproducing agent that is considerably smaller than a bacterium and can multiply only within the living cells of a suitable host
- 25 Food and Drug Administration.
- 26 Center for Disease Control.
- 27 Single-celled microorganisms
- 28 A group of one-celled organisms that generally do not contain chlorophyll, sometimes classified as one-celled animals.
- 29 Green with vegetation; covered with growing plants or grass
- 30 Substance other than food that may harbor or transmit a disease.

- 2 A lower order of plant organisms, excluding bacteria, which contains

- no chlorophyll, has no vascular system, and is not differentiated into roots, stems, or leaves.
- 3 – Spread of disease by direct or indirect contact.
- 4 A regulation under police power for the exclusion or isolation of animal and plant pests or diseases and insects
- 5 United States Department of Agriculture
- 6 Animal or person in apparently good health who harbors pathogenic microorganisms.
- 8 Any agent such as an insect or animal that transmits, carries, or spreads a disease from one plant or animal to another.
- 9 Environmental Protection Agency.
- 12 Any deviation from a normal state of health in plants, animals, or people, which temporarily impairs vital functions.
- 13 An acute, highly communicable disease of clovenfooted animals
- 15 Pertaining to the body as a whole and not confined to one organ or part of the body
- 18 To control or direct by a rule
- 19 A disease caused by bacteria, protozoa, viruses, or fungi entering the body.
- 20 Food Safety and Inspection Service.
- 21 Fungi distinguished by the formation of a mycelium
- 24 Abnormal form of protein that clumps together inside a cell.
