### **SWEETHEART BALL DANCE'S RESPONSIBILITIES:**

1. To hold regular meetings with committee members as needed.
2. To appoint a secretary to record minutes of the meeting.
3. To decide as a group which items need to be done to conduct a Dance.
4. To work with the FHA representative on coordinating the dance.
5. To hire a DJ.
6. To decorate for the dance.
7. To hold elections for Dance Queen and King Candidates.
8. To clean up after the dance.
9. To formulate a budget to be presented to the Treasurer by August 30.

### **PARENT-MEMBER BANQUET'S RESPONSIBILITIES:**

**ROLAND-STORY CHAPTER  
FFA  
IOWA ASSOCIATION**

**ARTICLE 1 -- NAME AND PURPOSES**

Section A--The name of this organization shall be the Roland-Story Chapter of the FFA.  
Members are here in after referred to in all as FFA and the letters FFA are used to designate the chapter, its activities, and for members thereof.

Section B--The purpose for which this chapter is formed are as follows:

1. to develop competent agricultural/agribusiness leadership.
2. to strengthen the confidence of FFA members in themselves.
3. to create more interest in agribusiness and agricultural occupations.
4. to encourage members to improve their home and surroundings.
5. to participate in cooperative efforts.
6. to develop leadership, citizenship, and patriotism.
7. to participate in undertakings to improve the community.
8. to encourage and promote thrift.
9. to encourage organized recreational activities.

**ARTICLE 2 --ORGANIZATION**

Section A--The Roland-Story Chapter of FFA is a Chartered local unit of the Iowa Association of FFA which is chartered by the National Organization of the FFA.

Section B--This chapter accepts in full the provisions in the constitution and bylaws of the Iowa Association of the FFA as well as those of the National Association of the FFA. Minimum qualifications for the Greenhand Degree are:

1. learn and explain the FFA creed, motto, and salute.
2. describe the FFA emblem, colors, and symbols.
3. explain the proper use of the jacket.
4. have a satisfactory knowledge of the FFA history.
5. know the duties and responsibilities of FFA members.
6. have access to official manual and handbook.
7. must have paid annual dues. (AMENDED AT MAY 1996 MEETING)

Section C--Chapter Farmer Degree. Minimum Chapter Qualifications.

1. must have earned the Greenhand Degree.
2. must have an approved SAE program and have kept records.
3. must be actively involved in chapter activities.
4. must be familiar with parliamentary procedure.
5. must have paid annual dues. (AMENDED AT MAY 1996 MEETING)

**Section D--State Farmer Degree.**

1. all qualifications are set by the State Association.

**Section E--American Farmer Degree.**

1. qualifications are those that are set by the National Association.

**ARTICLE 3 --MEMBERSHIP**

Section A--Membership in this chapter is of 3 kinds: Active, Alumni, and Honorary as defined by the National FFA Constitution.

Section B--The regular work of this chapter shall be carried on by the active membership.

Section C--Honorary membership in this chapter will be limited to the Honorary Chapter Farmer Degree.

Section D--Active members in good standing may vote on all business brought before the chapter. An active member will be considered in good standing when:

1. they attend local chapter meetings with reasonable regularity.
2. they show interest in and take part in the affairs of the chapter.
3. they pay their dues regularly.
4. all Agriculture Education students are considered active members of the Roland-Story FFA Chapter, however, only those who pay dues are eligible for Sub-district, District, State, & National sponsored activities. It is the discretion of the Advisor to limit non-dues paying members in other activities involving the chapter. (THIS WAS DROPPED AT THE MAY 1996 MEETING... (AMENDED AT MAY 1996 MEETING)).

Section E--Names of applicants for membership will be filed with the state association by October 1.

Section A--the emblem of the FFA will be the emblem for the chapter.

Section B-- Emblems used by the members will be designated by the National FFA Organization.

**ARTICLE 5 --MEMBERSHIP DEGREES AND PRIVILEGES**

Section A--There will be four grades of active membership as specified by the National FFA Association.

Section B--All greenhands are entitled to wear the regulation bronze emblem pin. All Chapter Farmers are entitled to wear the Silver emblem pin. All State Farmers are entitled to wear the Gold emblem charm. All American Farmers are entitled to wear the regulation Gold emblem key.

ARTICLE 6 --LOCAL MEMBERSHIP ACTIVITIES (amendment to constitution passed on September 17, 1988).

SECTION A--Only those dues paying members who have met established criteria determined by the Chapter Advisor are eligible for attending FFA summer trips and other approved chapter activities where travel is required.

Section B--The chapter PRESIDENT(S) shall determine a point system that shall reward those members who actively participate in various approved chapter functions. The form of reward will be monetary, in that it will help pay all or part of the member's expenses towards that summer trip, and/or other approved chapter trips.  
(AMENDED AT MAY 1996 MEETING)

SECTION C--(amendment offered and passed on October 7, 1989). Only dues paying members are eligible to participate in any function sponsored by the local chapter.  
(SECTION C WAS RECONSIDERED AT MAY 1996 MEETING WHERE IT WAS DEFEATED).

ARTICLE 7 --CHAPTER STRUCTURE--AMENDMENT OFFERED TO THE CHAPTER CONSTITUTION AT THE OCTOBER 1981 MEETING.

Section A--The Roland-Story Chapter of FFA shall be governed by a student body determined by election each spring. Officers to be elected shall include: President(s), Vice-President(s), Secretary, Treasurer, Reporter, and Sentinel. Members desiring an office must file with the Advisor an application not less than one week prior to elections.

Section B--The ballot shall list all members who have filed for an office.

Section C--The Roland-Story Chapter will have 11 committees with each committee having 1 representative on the executive chapter committee. Those committees and committee chairperson will be appointed during the spring of the year following officer elections. (this section was amended at the September 1990 meeting to change the number of committees from 12 to 11)

Section D--The executive committee will meet prior to each chapter meeting to set the meetings agenda.

Section E--Any changes in this Constitution and its bylaws must win approval by a 2/3 vote of the eligible members in good standing of the chapter. A quorum of at least 40 % of the active members must be present.

Section F--Any motions made involving the expenditures of money involving a sum of \$75.00 or more per item must be made at least 1 month prior to approval. All items of business involving approval for expenditures must be passed by a 2/3 majority vote of the members present. This bylaw may be waived at the discretion of the chapter advisor.
