In this assignment, each of you will be creating a video using photographs downloaded from the internet to explain the main concepts of weather patterns as indicated in your books. Your video will need to have pictures that best represent illustrations from this chapter. Your video will be 2 to 3 minutes long.

The program you will be using is called '**iMovie**'. If your computer won't work, then you will be using a Macintosh in the library.

Procedures: You may need to research out on 'atomiclearning.com' for more specifics on using iMovie if you are having difficulty and/or visit with Mrs. Huber in the library for assistance.

1. Research what pictures you will need Read through the chapter and come up with 20 to 24 pictures to be used..... no picture should last more than 6 seconds.
2. Create a new movie and place a title slide onto it.
3. Insert in your pictures. Place in any transitions.
4. Insert in your movie you will be using if you can't get this part done in 5 minutes or less, ask Mr. Taylor for help.
5. Put an ending slide onto your movie.
